Amber Class Summer 2 Curriculum



Hello everyone! This half term Amber class will be working on the topic of 'Beaches' where we will explore lots about the seaside and under the sea. We will look at different animals that live there along with the things we can do at the seaside. We have already asked the children things that they would like to learn from this topic and they came up with some amazing questions including "Why is the sea salty?" and "What is the biggest sea creature?". Plus, we're intrigued to discover what sand is made of and how all those tiny grains come together to create our lovely beaches. It's going to be a fun learning adventure!

In English, Reception children have been doing amazing work practising reading and writing words. We are gradually building this up and looking at longer words with multi syllables. This term we will be writing sentences all about beaches and things we like to do while at the beach. We will continue to practise correct letter formation while writing our fantastic sentences. Year 1 pupils will explore lots of different texts and write all about beaches including writing post cards and letters. They will continue to practise their independent writing while writing facts and lists around the classroom. We will also use some prefixes and suffixes.

Reception children will be learning about different areas of maths through practical and fun activities. There will be lots of opportunities to count, read, recognise and order numbers to 20 both in the classroom and outside. We will continue to look at adding and subtracting numbers in lots of fun and practical ways along with exploring doubling and even/odd numbers. Year 1 children will continue to look at fractions before exploring place value up to 100, money and time. We do this through lots of practical methods and give the children lots of time to explore their new skills within the class.

In PE, we will all be doing **Athletics** and **Tennis**. Our PE days are a **Thursday** and a **Friday**. We ask children to come to school in their PE kit on PE days and they will stay in their kit all day. As you know, we do lots of outdoor learning in Amber Class. Please ensure your children come to school in appropriate footwear and named jumpers/cardigans/hats. Our outdoor learning mornings where we have our lessons in the garden will be every **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**. Please also ensure children have sun cream on when they come to school and a bottle for them to reapply throughout the day.

We will be learning about the following topics in our foundation subjects:

- Science: Animal habitats

- Art: Landscapes

History: Seaside heroes of the past


- Life Skills: Respectful relationships



Welcome back everyone!

We are entering the final term of the year with lots to look forward to and the class being simply adorable. It is so great to see how far the children have come and how enthusiastic they are.

This term we will be reading The Tunnel by Anthony Brown and using the text to inspire some discussions and creative writing. We will be writing some diaries, some instructional writing and some stories, as well as continuing our focus on linking ideas with conjunctions.

In Maths we will continue to look at the four main operations in our maths fluency as well as having a big push on our times tables. We will also be learning to tell the time and how to measure accurately.

In History we are learning all about Ancient Rome. It is a fantastic topic with so many fun and interesting elements to it. We are going to have a banquet for our DT topic and learn how to season food with herbs, make shields, make pottery in art and learn many fun facts about the impact of Rome on our culture.

In PE we will be playing tennis and practising our athletics skills ahead of Sports Week in July. Our Colby Value is Personal, thinking about how we cope with success and failure in sport and in life and strategies we can develop to help with this.


We are to be putting a lot of energy into our times tables this term so as always, could you please practise these at home alongside reading three times a week and signing diaries.

Ruby Class Curriculum Information Summer 2025

Welcome back after half term. I hope you had a great time and got to enjoy the lovely weather. This half term we will be using the book The Butterfly Lion and we will be using it as inspiration to write a new chapter for the book. We will also be having another focus on punctuation and grammar throughout the half term. We will still be continuing with our weekly spelling tests and we would appreciate it if you could continue to support your child with learning these. They continue to be available on Google Classroom as well as on Spelling Shed so if your child does not stick them in their books there are other ways of finding their spellings.

In Maths, we will be looking at the different properties of triangles and quadrilaterals. We will also be finding out about different size angles, how to estimate them and also how to accurately find the angle using a protractor. We will also learn how to work out angles on a straight line or a 360 degree turn. We will also be looking at translations and reflections on a grid. Our final topic will be looking at line graphs and timetables. The Year 4s will be doing the national multiplication test next week so any chance you have to learn these over the weekend would be really helpful. The children will also be learning them at school throughout their maths lessons.

In Science, we will be learning about the life cycle of humans. We will be looking at the different stages of our life cycle and we will particularly be looking at puberty. This will include talking about periods in girls as well as how our hormones can make us feel throughout this time of change. This is also part of our Life Skills lessons this half term.

Our Geography topic is learning all about maps. We will be looking at the different types of maps there are and what uses each one has. We will be learning about longitude and latitude.

In Music this term, we will be continuing to learn the ukulele with Ms Barber from the Norfolk Music Service. The children have been doing really well already and most of them can already play 2 chords with many being able to play 3 or 4 chords. We are also looking forward to performing with Tim Brain at the Royal Norfolk Show where we will be using drumsticks to tap along to 3 well known tunes. We have taken part in several events at the Royal Norfolk Show over the last few years and the children have also enjoyed them.

This half term will be busy with sports as we will be having our yearly sports week as well as our PE sessions each week. We will be focusing on athletics and the children will be working hard to improve their previous athletic scores.

They will be learning about and making their own spices with Mr Frost as part of their design & technology, databases with Mrs Moulton in computing and with Mr Mead they will be teaching French and RE.

And of course, how can we forget the day (well night) they have all been looking forward to all year, the Crazy Sleepover!

Amethyst's Curriculum second half of Summer term

Hi, I hope you all had a great half-term holiday!

Maths: We continue to follow the National Curriculum for maths, but we will build in lots of leadership time for maths development and also game creation, putting into practice all the skills the children have learned.

Science: We will be covering animals including humans.

English: Our key text this half-term is Rose Blanche. It is based on a young German child's experiences during WWII and compliments our Battle of Britain unit.

History: We are exploring the causes and effects of The Battle of Britain.

P.E: It is athletics and tennis. We will be testing and competing against ourselves and others. Please can children have trainers at school every day as we will try to add in extra sessions at short notice.

R.E: We are looking at Religion and its role in conflict.

French: Mr. Mead is covering key vocabulary and phrases as revision for High School.

Computing: Children will be combining graphics and photo editing.

Music: This is a composition unit where children are setting music to match a theme.

Life Skills: This half-term Amethyst is covering the themes of changing bodies and moving into adolescence, transition to new classes and legacy projects as well as recovering what a good role model looks like.
