Emerald Class Update!

Times tables

We are now up and running with times tables for this year and children should be familiar with what the expectations are. They will have an informal test on Thursdays. This will be marked and recorded but only so we can show progress and monitor what tables they are working on throughout the year. Ideally Year 3's will know the multiplication and division facts for the 2,3,4,5,8 and 11 times tables by the end of term.

Year 4's expectation is that they know all of their remaining tables as well.

They will practise their tables in school 3 times per week but it is expected that they practise at home twice a week as well. This can be on a computer or just playing a game/worksheet, whatever works best for their learning style.

Spellings

Children have all been given their spellings which were determined by a start of the year quick quiz. They all have a RED SPELLING BOOK which will come home with their words for the week. They are expected to practise twice each week in preparation for a spelling test which will be on a Monday or Wednesday morning. They all have access to SPELLING SHED where they can find their words in case they are away on the day we hand them out.

Reading

All the children have heard reading within the first couple of weeks and it has been lovely to hear how much they are enjoying their books this term so far. It is a Colby expectation that children read aloud to an adult at home three times each week. Can reading diaries be signed so that we know if this is happening and keep on track if anyone needs any extra support. Even for children who are now reading chapter books it is really important that their comprehension and understanding is supported at home and at school.

Homework

I had some spare textbooks in the cupboard which I gave to the class last week. They had fun decorating the covers and have been really keen to bring in homework. It has been lovely to see the variety of fantastic ideas the children have and I encourage them all to show me whatever they find interesting.

I don't expect them or ask them to do any set homework other than spellings and times tables. The books are purely optional fun and for extra work they choose to do and can allow the children a chance to earn stickers and prizes if they bring anything in.

Safe Practice in Physical Education

The Local Authority issues the following guidance in relation to body piercing and its implications to safety in Physical Education. Norfolk LA supports and follows the good practice guide produced by the British Association of Advisers and Lecturers in Physical Education. In keeping with BAALPE's "Safe Practice" document:

"all adornments should be removed before the physical education lesson" If your child is able to take out their own earrings, they will need to do this before PE lessons. If your child finds it difficult to remove their earrings you may prefer to send them to school without earrings on the days they have PE lessons. Please can children have hairbands available to tie back their hair for PE lessons. Thank you.
