# Communication during emergencies!

There are very occasionally times when we have unusual events (power-cuts etc.) and need to contact you quickly. We use the Colby Facebook page and Colby FOCS WhatsApp groups to reach as many people as possible at once. Our telephone landline doesn't work without electricity and mobile telephone signal at school is temperamental. Telephoning you all individually is a slow process. Please sign up to the Colby Facebook page and Colby FOCS WhatsApp groups, if you haven't already done so. It really helps with quick communication. Thank you.

Helping your child to read

During their first term in Amber Class, our Reception children enjoyed daily phonics sessions and were introduced to many initial letter sounds. These sessions are the early part of reading and will continue this term. Children will have been bringing home a reading book for you to share with them.

Most of you will probably have used different strategies to learn to read than we use in school today. We thought it might be helpful for you to have some support with hearing your child read.

We call each sound a letter and 2 - 3 letters make a PHONEME. The GRAPHEME is how it looks. These are taught in a special order because education specialists have worked out that this is the best way to help children to learn to read. The phonemes / graphemes are also split into groups called PHASES.

Each sound makes a very short sound. You may remember bring taught T as a 'ter' sound. Now is it is a very short and snappy 't'. If you whisper it, it is easier to make the sound.

Each reading book has the phonemes it contains listed and practising these before reading is a good idea. Books are matched closely with phonemes covered in their phonics sessions so your child should be able to sound out the majority of the words.

Being able to BLEND phonemes to make words, c...a...t is cat is really important and before trying you should make sure that your child recognises each phoneme.
